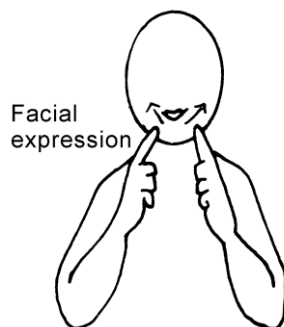
Did you know that being outdoors, connecting with nature and the natural world is good for us?
