## Speech Marks

The direct words spoken are between the speech marks



The spoken words end with either a <u>question mark</u>, <u>exclamation mark</u> or <u>comma</u> before the speech mark

 There is a <u>reporting clause</u> to explain who is speaking either before or after the spoken words. E.g.

> said Mrs Jones Jennifer shouted Alfie whispered
