Our School

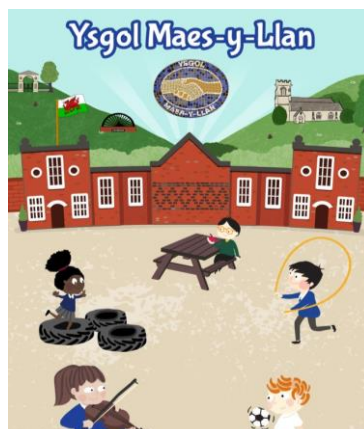
Ysgol Maes y Llan is situated in the village of Ruabon, near Wrexham. We are very proud of our school, which has had a prominent position within Ruabon since 1911. Although Maes-y-Llan has grown considerably over the years, we have retained a close-knit family feel. Currently, there are 141 pupils on roll, aged from 3 to 11, including 8 nursery children who attend part-time. We also offer Early Education for children the term after they are 3 years old. There are currently six classes at the school.

Ysgol Maes-y-Llan is a place where children become independent learners through a world of discovery. Our school is a friendly, welcoming community where everybody works together to promote enjoyment in learning in an uplifting and motivated atmosphere where equality, opportunity and freedom of expression is welcomed.

At Ysgol Maes-y-Llan, our wonderful staff aim to ignite a thirst and love of learning. We aim to inspire independent, creative, sociable and inquisitive life-long learners who are engaged in achieving their full potential. We pride ourselves on excellent relationships, high expectations, mutual trust and understanding.

Ysgol Maes y Llan is an English Medium school where Welsh is taught as a second language. Children have the opportunity to be part of a Welsh pupil group called Criw Cymreig. They help drive the use of Welsh throughout school. They have many responsibilities, such as:

- Hosting assemblies in Welsh,
- Planning Welsh games for the school yard and showing children how to play these games,
- Taking part in 'Learning Walks' around school to check classes and other areas have Welsh signs, displays and are carrying out Helpwr Heddiw activities,
 - Helping to plan Welsh week and the Eisteddfod,
- Giving out prizes and certificates when they hear Welsh being spoken



Welsh as a Second Language

Welsh is taught as a timetabled session and where possible during other lessons. In addition we endeavor to foster in children a love of Wales, it's culture and it's language. Incidental Welsh is used throughout the day to encourage this.

Outdoor Learning.

Our curriculum will provide lots of opportunities for outdoor learning activities which will take place in either our outdoor provision or in our amazing forest school area. These experiences will broaden the children's knowledge and skills, embedding the four purposes, develop a wide range of physical skills, including balance, coordination, and dexterity, in a natural environment. Additionally, outdoor play provides an opportunity for children to take reasonable risks and challenge themselves, which is essential for healthy child development.

Religion, Values and Ethics (RVE)

We follow the Agreed Syllabus for Religious Education, which meets the religion, values and ethics requirements of the Curriculum for Wales. Pupils will have the opportunity to learn about the other major religions, their practices and customs, and non-religious, philosophical convictions.

Relationships and Sexuality Education (RSE)

Relationships and Sexuality Education is a mandatory element of the Curriculum for Wales and is approached with sensitivity and care. Our policy has been developed by teachers and members of the Governing Body and aims to implement an age appropriate approach. Parents/Carers who have any concerns are welcome to arrange a meeting –in confidence– with the class teacher to discuss these concerns and see the teaching and learning materials that are used in the sessions.

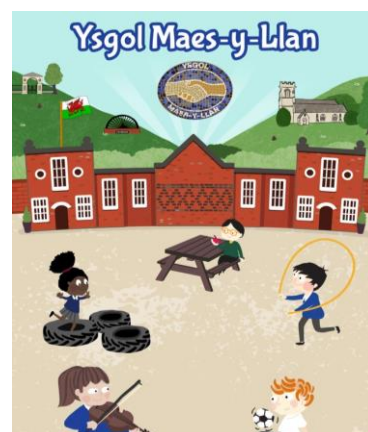

The School Day

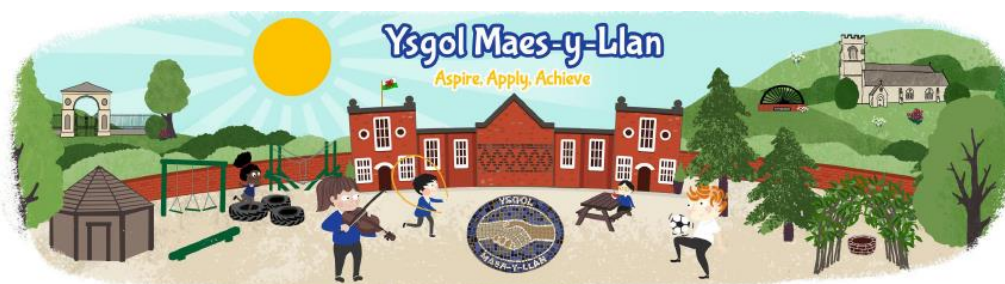

If it is very difficult for you to contact us on the first day of absence, then we ask that you do so **as soon as possible**. If this information is not forthcoming then the absence is deemed to be 'unauthorised' and, by law, has to be reported as such to the appropriate authorities.

Taking Holidays in Term Time

Please be aware that leave of absence for the purposes of holidays is not a parents', carers' right but must be authorised by Mrs Beth Rolls the Headteacher or Mrs Jo Gruffydd the Deputy Headteacher. Holidays will not be authorised if a child's attendance is already below 95%. Periods longer than ten days must be deemed to be unauthorised absences.

Admissions

The LA manages admissions and transfers to the school on our behalf. Our admission number is 25 per year group.

Children are eligible for Nursery in the September after they have their third birthday. In accordance with LA Policy, they are offered Nursery Education for **five, two and a half hour sessions per week** throughout the school year. Prospective parents, carers and children are invited and warmly encouraged to come to our Nursery 'Stay and Play' Open Afternoon, usually held during the Summer Term. There they can meet the Teacher and Learning Support Staff and familiarise themselves with the Nursery environment.

Children are admitted into Reception in the September after they have their fourth birthday. Prospective parents, carers and children are invited and warmly encouraged to come to our Reception Open Afternoon, usually held during the Summer Term. There they can meet the Teacher and Learning Support Staff and familiarise themselves with the Reception environment. Those children who are already attending our Nursery provision within Maes-y-Llan, will have already taken place in several transition sessions in order to smooth the transition between classes.

All prospective parents and carers are very welcome to come and visit our School. Please make an appointment by contacting us first, as this ensures that a member of staff is available to show you around and answer any questions you may have.

Transfer to Secondary Education

Under the Education Act 1980, parents are free to state which Secondary School they wish their child to attend. Ysgol Maes-y-Llan children usually transfer to Ysgol Rhiwabon after Year 6.

Applications for secondary schools take place during the Autumn term, after you have had the opportunity to visit the different settings' Open Evenings.

Throughout years 5 and 6, pupils have opportunities to attend different transition sessions at Ysgol Rhiwabon during the school day.

During the Summer Term your child will attend transfer days at the secondary school of their choice.

Towards the end of the Summer Term, prior to transfer, the children and you will be given opportunities to visit the Secondary School of your choice.

Early Education

Contact Information

Parents must ensure that we always have correct, up-to-date information such as changes of address, telephone numbers, emergency contact numbers and medical information.

It can be very distressing for a child if they are unwell and need to go home and we are unable to get in touch with a parent or other family member.

Personal Items

Please do not allow your child to bring personal items (including mobile telephones, tablets and smart watches) or toys to school. The school insurance does not cover property lost or damaged in school.

School safety

To ensure staff and children are safe at all times:

- All doors and gates are locked at 8:50am and entry can only be gained by the main Reception.
- Visitors have to report to Reception and wear a red or green lanyard
- Staff supervise the yards during playtimes and lunchtimes
- There are CCTV cameras around the buildings and grounds.
- The school premises are strictly non-smoking areas, this includes vaping.
- Dogs are not allowed on the premises (with the exception of guide dogs)

First Aid and Medication

Teachers and non-teaching staff attend First Aid Courses to update their First Aid skills. Staff are vigilant to child injuries and record them systematically.

Parents/carers are notified should their child receive First Aid whilst under the care of the school. The school also records incidents of a serious nature on the Local Authority reporting system.

At times of concern, parents/carers are contacted immediately. It is therefore imperative that parents provide up-to-date telephone contact numbers for home or place of work, plus an additional emergency contact number of a close relative. Parents/carers are asked to confirm or update their contact numbers at the start of every academic year.

Should your child require medication during the school day, a consent form must be completed, which you can request from the school office.



Safeguarding and Security

If, on any occasion, you need to collect your child during normal school hours (doctor, dentist, optician appointment etc.) please inform the school by e-mail, letter, telephone call or personal visit in advance. If you have a copy of the appointment card or letter, could you please bring it with you when you collect your child and share it with the office staff, thank you.

Help us to keep your child safe by:

- ALWAYS **parking your car safely outside the school grounds**, whilst also being considerate of our neighbours. Please do not block driveways or park on the raised crossing area. Only staff and authorised vehicles are allowed through the vehicular access gates.
- ALWAYS using the **pedestrian access when walking** onto the school grounds. No one should walk down the vehicular access to the staff car park.
- ALWAYS telling the school beforehand if you need to take your child out for an appointment during school hours.
- ALWAYS letting the school know if you are going to be late collecting your child or if they are to be collected by another adult. **We only release children to parents or carers authorised by parents.**
- ENSURING the school has an **up to date** emergency contact number for use during school hours.
- ALWAYS informing us of any change to your normal routine.

Child Protection

We adhere to the 'All Wales Child Protection Procedures, revised 2008' and the local protocol for Education and Leisure staff, as approved by the local Safeguarding Children's Board and therefore **all staff have a legal duty to refer any concerns about the well-being of any pupil to the Social Services Department and/or School Medical Officer.**

All members of staff have been trained in Child Protection / Safeguarding and new members of staff are trained as soon as possible after appointment.

Any offers of help, either in an official capacity on the committee or purely on a voluntary basis at individual functions, are most welcome. Meetings, social functions and fund-raising activities are arranged on a regular basis and are publicised through the school Website, App and newsletters. The funds raised by our group provide our children and the school with many additional resources we would otherwise have to do without.

Reporting to parents.

You will have the opportunity to meet your child's teacher formally, 3 times a year. Early in the Autumn term each class usually has a 'Meet the Teacher' session, when the class teachers will introduce themselves and explain what your child will be learning during the school year. In the Spring, there will be an opportunity for you to have a consultation with the class teacher and see the children's work and discuss their progress. In the Summer term, you will be invited to discuss your child's end of year report if you wish to do so.

Taking of Photographs

There will be many precious moments during your child's journey at Ysgol Maes-y-Llan, and we appreciate that you may want to capture many of these moments by taking photographs. The taking of personal photographs during concerts, performances, sports days, assemblies etc. is welcomed, however, we ask you to respect the views of all our parents and carers in that you only take pictures of your own child(ren) and not put photographs with other children on Social Networking Sites such as Facebook, Twitter, Instagram etc. Thank you. Failure to comply with these requests could jeopardise the safeguarding and/or safety of some of our children.

Prior to releasing any of our children's names and photographs we will gain parental/guardian permission. A form will be distributed at the start of the year.



Press and Publicity

In line with advice from the LA, it is the practice of the school to release pupils' names to the press to accompany photographs, such as those to celebrate individual or team successes. If any parents, carers object to photographs or names of their children appearing in the press, then they should complete the photo consent forms, sent out at the start of every academic year, to that effect.

As parents and educators, we all want the best for your children. To that end, based on national and Maes-y-Llan's own data, reading at home will continue to be the main homework request from all classes, as reading at home is shown time and time again to have a massive impact on children's academic progress.

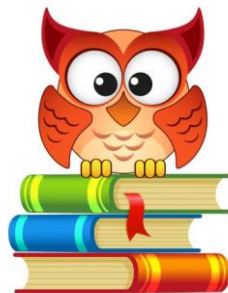
Your child is never too young to start enjoying books.

- Read aloud to your child, talk about the words and pictures, and share ideas, likes and opinions about the book.
- Read yourself: a book, newspaper (even if it is just the sport pages), instructions, timetables etc.. Children who see adults reading are much more likely to want to read themselves.
- Make sure your child is surrounded by books. You don't need hundreds of books at home, but make regular trips to the library, charity shops or bookshop, not just to borrow books but to spend time together browsing and learning to make choices. In this way, reading becomes a habit. There are also a wealth of free eBooks online at www.oxfordowl.co.uk. Most importantly, talk to them about books: your favourite childhood stories or fairy tales, or about what you are reading now.

Impact of Reading at Home

Children are taught the skills of reading in Maes-y-Llan through learning sounds, graphemes, phonemes, blending and comprehension skills. As with any other skill, the more you practice, the more confident and competent you become. By reading at home, your children are having more opportunities to practice the skills taught in school, and they will make quicker progress both in reading and in their overall confidence.

Please help us help your children by supporting their reading at home and ensuring their reading diaries are signed and brought into school.



Lunch Time Arrangements

Wrexham School Meals Service provide us with a menu and themed meal days which are advertised on our school website, app and newsletters.

School Meals

School dinners are now provided free of charge. Meal choices have to be ordered on ParentPay and can be done so up to 2 weeks in advance. You also need to remember:

- orders need to be placed by 8am
- the list of children who have ordered a school meal cannot be updated after 8am so if you haven't ordered a meal, your child will need to bring a packed lunch

We kindly ask that if you have ordered a meal for your child and change your mind, please cancel the order before 8am on the day. The number of meals that are prepared each day is based on the number of orders received, so if you order a meal, but give your child a packed lunch, food will go to waste.

Healthy Packed Lunches

We encourage children to eat healthy packed lunches. Supervision and accommodation are provided for children bringing packed lunches to school. All lunches should be packed in a suitable container and should **not contain fizzy cans of pop, energy drinks or glass bottles**. To help develop your child's independence, it is useful for the packaging to be easily opened by them. Children could practice this at home.

Healthy Snacks

We encourage pupils to eat healthily in line with the LA and Welsh Government Guidelines and have adopted the Healthy Schools Policy. We provide the children the option of a fresh fruit snack for their morning break. This is charged at £1.00 per week payable half termly in advance. We also provide Foundation Phase children with a complimentary carton of semi-skimmed milk.

The KS2 pupils may bring their own 'healthy snacks' i.e. **a piece of fruit or vegetables for break times**.

All children are encouraged to bring in water bottles, which they can refill in school when they need to during playtimes and lunchtimes.



Educational Visits & Visitors to the School

In order to support the broad, exciting curriculum we offer pupils at Ysgol Maes-y-Llan, we also value the importance of being able to take the pupils out of the school environment, or have outside providers bring the experiences to the school. Educational Visits/Visitors are used to support and enhance topics being taught.

Residential visits to Glan Llyn during Years 5 and 6, encourage pupils to use their Welsh Language skills and learn about the Welsh Culture. Children are also given opportunities to experience activities they may not otherwise have had.

Charging and Remissions Policy

In accordance with the Education Act 1988, the Governing Body has a duty to develop and publish a Charging and Remission Policy for the school. This document is available from the school office. Parents/carers are asked to make a voluntary contribution towards the cost of transport to various trips and swimming lessons.

Parents/carers in receipt of certain state benefits may be entitled to some remission on certain activities.

Physical Education and Sport

Our aims for physical education are that:

- every child will experience a range of physical education activities,
- every child will physically challenge themselves,
- every child will understand how beneficial exercise is to our health and
- every child will build life-long habits which will benefit their health and wellbeing.

Physical Education has a substantial contribution to make to the total education of each and every child. Physical Education is a compulsory part of the School's curriculum and should therefore be undertaken by all pupils. **Pupils can only be excused from P.E. on medical grounds and a note is required to that effect, from parents or a doctor.**

Pupils should be **dressed appropriately** for P.E. activities for **health and safety** reasons.

Swimming

Key stage 2 children will take part in swimming lessons. These lessons are held at Chirk swimming baths.

The aim is that all pupils should be able to swim 25 metres by the end of Key Stage 2. However, as we believe swimming is also a life skill, when able, pupils will have the opportunity to work towards Personal Survival Awards.

Pupils require a towel and appropriate costume for swimming. Long hair must be tied back or a swimming cap worn and if your child has a verruca they would need to wear a swimming sock. A contribution of £2 per week is asked from parents towards the cost of transport.

Extra Curricular activities

Throughout the year we aim to offer a variety of After School Clubs from 3:15pm until 4pm.



Children with Additional Learning Needs

Our school works within the 'Code of Practice for Wales' for children with Additional Needs. The School seeks to ensure that **all children with Additional Learning Needs (ALN)**, whether physical, cognitive, medical, social or emotional, **receive appropriate educational provision**, which will enable them to access the whole curriculum and fulfil their potential. We work closely with outside agencies, such as the Educational Psychologist, the Education Social Worker, the Attendance Officer, the School Nurse, Doctors, Physiotherapists, Occupational Therapists, Speech Therapists and the LA, to support every individual child and their particular needs.

Initial concerns regarding a child may come from teachers within the school, parents, carers or another agency. Following an initial period of detailed observation and assessment either in school or at the Assessment Centre, the individual needs of each child is considered, an action plan drawn up and appropriate provision made.

Parents and carers are kept informed of the progress regularly and liaison between the Class Teacher and our Additional Needs Co-ordinator, **Mrs Belinda Jackson (Mrs Rhian Steele in her absence)**.

We have a commitment that, wherever possible, children with physical disabilities will be educated in their local primary school. If required, adaptations to the building will be considered by the school and the Local Authority to enable a child to attend our school.

Complaints Procedure

It is hoped that you never have cause to complain. However, we do have a Complaints Procedure document available from the school office or school website.

Verbal abuse or aggression towards staff, other parents or pupils will not be tolerated. If you have any concerns, please follow the appropriate guidelines and let school know as soon as possible. We can only address concerns if we know about them.

Social Networking Sites such as Facebook should not be used to name or make comments about school negatively. Social Media will not solve a complaint or concern, school will.

E safety

We have a policy for Internet safety: please contact school to request one.

All children are advised to use the internet correctly and safely. Our Digital Champion **Mrs Amy Guiel** supports staff with the implementation of the Digital Competency Framework.
